Distillation is a response to the recent cessation of the peat harvesting industry in Ireland. Over the past year, Luke has collaborated with renowned perfume maker Joan Woods to create a unique distillation of the Midlands bog—the place where he grew up—as the starting point for an olfactory encounter which looks at our human relationship to place. Dedicated to the future of our broken landscapes—in the hope that by listening to them, we might be able to better understand them.

Luke is the recipient of the Norman Houston Multidisciplinary Commissioning Award 2023 with Solas Nua. He is currently working from STABLE Arts in Washington DC as part of a research residency towards the development of the project which will premiere later this year.

One Moment Now is a brand new table-top audio-experience commissioned by Bewley's Café Theatre, now making its North American premiere with Solas Nua. Through headphones, you'll hear fragments of a story—about memory, about grandsons and grandmothers, about coffee shops and hospital visits—and be invited to participate as it plays out on the table in front of you.

Solas Nua's Artistic Director of Theatre Rex Daugherty shares, "I've been watching Murmuration for a few years now and have admired their singular approach to theatre making. They create intimate, private experiences that occur in public spaces, and it has been capturing the imagination of audiences, as well as forging new grounds for where theatre takes place. There's a special magic when immersed in this setting, and I'm eager to share it with DC audiences." This highly inventive approach to theatre making, combined with years of experience producing in non-traditional spaces shows why Washington City Paper has acknowledged Solas Nua as "Washington's finest purveyor of sitespecific theatre."

Solas Nua is thrilled to be back at Eaton DC, which previously hosted their critically acclaimed, sold out run of The Smuggler. Starring Rex Daugherty in this soloperformance, the show was picked by The New York Times as one of the best productions of 2019. Eaton DC was named by Time Magazine as one of the top 100 Places to Visit on Earth. One Moment Now will be hosted inside of Eaton's resident coffee shop, Baker's Daughter, which is a boutique café from 101 Hospitality, the team behind Gravitas and Michele's. With three locations in Washington, D.C., the all-day cafe offers breakfast, coffee, baked goods and prepared foods. Chef Matt Baker owns and operates Gravitas, which received one star in the 2020 and 2021 Washington, D.C. MICHELIN Guides.

We are also delighted to be hosted by the Tony-Award winning company, Woolly Mammoth, for a three week run of One Moment Now. Woolly has a national reputation for their courageous and innovative productions, and Solas Nua is honored to be invited by this esteemed company to present our work in their season.


Murmuration's One Moment Now in Washington, D.C. is supported by Culture Ireland

and will be part of a larger North American tour for the production. Future dates and locations will be announced at a later time.

ABOUT MURMURATION

Murmuration is a Dublin-based collective of theatre artists, making live, narrative sound installations in nontraditional spaces. They create rich, intricate soundscapes with the aim of fostering new ways of listening in our audiences. Their work is all about big-hearted close listening.

Through their work they seek to reposition audiences in relation to their surroundings, creating vivid imaginary worlds. They have performed in bars, shopfronts, glass-walled galleries and public squares, without physically augmenting any of those spaces; aiming to find the extraordinary in ordinary and unlikely locations. They believe this approach to be particularly urgent now, when cultural spaces seem to be shrinking and becoming less accessible. They remain resolutely optimistic about Dublin, and are committed to finding performative potential in its existing spaces, through the transformative power of sound and live performance. Murmuration formed in 2018 to present Summertime at Dublin Fringe Festival where it was nominated for a Judges Choice Award, before being shown at Drogheda Arts Festival and at the Abbey Young Curators' Festival the following year. In 2020 their second production, Will I See You There, premiered at the Gallery of Photography in Temple Bar as part of Dublin Fringe Festival, and in 2021 they were commissioned to make their third show You're Still Here at Dublin Castle, co-presented by Dublin Fringe and the Abbey Theatre, Ireland's national theatre. They have presented work-inprogress sharings of two other pieces: One Moment Now (2022), presented while inaugural Artists-in-Residence at Bewleys Café, and so close i noticed my breath on the glass (2020), presented as part of Corcadorca's SHOW Festival.

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But the real question is, where do you buy a hot pepper in Lucan?



Multimedia Exhibition from Solas Nua, DC's premier Irish arts organization, and Inaugural Norman Houston Multidisciplinary Award Recipient, Niamh McCann.

Washington, DC (Aug. 1, 2023)—Solas Nua, Washington DC's premier contemporary Irish arts organization, in collaboration with DC artist studio and gallery, STABLE Arts, announced someone decides, hawk or dove, a new body of work by Dublin-based mixed-media artist Niamh McCann as the inaugural recipient of Solas Nua's Norman Houston Multidisciplinary Commissioning Award. Someone decides, hawk or dove, seeks to subvert the assumed perspectives of social, political, and geographical landscapes. The work responds to the 1922 institutionalization of the Northern and Southern borders of Ireland and the ongoing consequences and reverberations of this partition. It combines sculpture, collage, and video, to examine the struggle between Northern and Southern Ireland during 'The Troubles'.

"Making is a form of challenging narrative," states McCann, "and someone decides, hawk or dove is a way of instinctively involving myself with subject, materials, and scale to a degree that risks and reinstates a reality more truthful than the fragmented, messy and disjointed nature of life, than 'fact."

McCann mines deep seams of colonialist atrocities and historic legacies to speculate on what language, story and imagery might be missing from accepted colonial narrative(s) or obstructed by its in-built global systems of naming, ownership, political power-play and cultural displacement. Concerned with acts of

remembrance and reflection, this work draws from territory borders, architecture, street names, flags and ceremonies to convolute history and to allow for elucidated slippages and the emergence of complex, non-linear narratives.

Work from someone decides, hawk or dove or iterations of same—has been shown at the Rudolf-Scharpf-Galerie, Ludwigshafen, Germany (hosted by Wilhelm-Hack-Museum), at Centre Culturel Irlandais, Paris and at The Boyne Valley Visitor Centre, Ireland.

ABOUT NIAMH MCCANN

A recipient of the 2022 Norman Houston Award from Solas Nua, McCann lives and works in Dublin. She is a recipient of the 2021 Stephen McKenna Fellowship from the Royal Hibernian Academy and is represented by Green On Red Gallery, Dublin. McCann's work is housed in the collections of The Irish Museum of Modern Art; The Arts Council/An Chomhairle Ealaíon; Limerick City Gallery, Swansea City Council; The London Institute; Hiscox, London and Dublin City Gallery, The Hugh Lane. Her work is supported by Solstice Arts Centre, Meath, Creative Ireland, Culture Ireland, the National College of Art and Design (Ireland) and the Arts Council/An Chomhairle Ealaíon.

ABOUT THE NORMAN HOUSTON MULTIDISCIPLINARY AWARD

The Norman Houston Project was initiated in 2022 by Solas Nua in Washington D.C., dedicated to the memory of Norman Houston, the former Director of the Northern Ireland Bureau (NIB), in the United States. It includes the Capital Irish Film Festival's Award for the best short film from Northern Ireland. and the Norman Houston Multidisciplinary Commissioning Award. This exciting opportunity was open to artists working in any discipline on the island of Ireland. Individuals or small collectives are both eligible. McCann engaged in a six-week research and development residency at STABLE Arts in 2022 and is now presenting someone decides, hawk or dove as the culmination of her two year commission.

ABOUT THE POET

Irish poet Jane Clarke is the author of three poetry collections and an illustrated poetry booklet. Her three collections were published by Bloodaxe Books, *The River* in 2015, *When the Tree Falls* in 2019 and *A Change in the Air* in 2023.

A Change in the Air is shortlisted for the Forward Prize for Best Collection 2023.

In 2016, *The River* was the first poetry collection ever shortlisted for the Royal Society

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of Literature Ondaatje Award, given for a distinguished work of fiction or non-fiction evoking the spirit of a place. When the Tree Falls was shortlisted for the Pigott Poetry Prize 2020, the Irish Times Poetry Now Award 2020 and the Farmgate Café National Poetry Award 2020 as well as being longlisted for the Royal Society for Literature Ondaatje Award 2020. 'Copper Soles' from When the Tree Falls is one of the highly commended poems in the Forward Book of Poetry 2021.

All the Way Home, an illustrated sequence of poems in response to a family archive of First World War photographs and letters held in the Mary Evans Picture Library, London, was published by Smith|Doorstop in April 2019.

Jane received the Ireland Chair of Poetry Travel Award 2022. In 2016 she received the Hennessy Literary Award for Emerging Poetry with three poems from *The River*. She also won the inaugural Listowel Writers' Week Poem of the Year at the Irish Book Awards 2016.

Originally from a farm in Roscommon, Jane now lives in Glenmalure, Co. Wicklow. She gratefully acknowledges the Arts Council of Ireland Literature Bursary Award 2021, Covid-19 Response Award 2020 and Literature Bursary Award 2017 and also the Wicklow County Council Artist Support Award 2019 and Culture Ireland support for readings in the UK and US.

ABOUT THE CRITIC

Ron Charles (Critic, Book World) writes about books and publishing for *The Washington Post*. For a dozen years, he enjoyed teaching American literature and critical theory in the Midwest. Before moving to the District, he edited the books section of the Christian Science Monitor in Boston. His wife is an English teacher and the cinematographer of their satirical series, "The Totally Hip Video Book Review."

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



ARTIST IN Residence

(SUMMER)



Luke Casserly is a multidisciplinary performance maker from Longford. Ireland. His work weaves together environmental research, documentary, sound art, and site as a way of carving out space for new possibilities to emerge between live performance and physical landscape. Often using autobiography as a starting point, his work attempts to stretch out new conversations around our human impact on the environment. This work has led to the creation of a network of Irish wildflower meadows across Ireland (1000 Miniature Meadows, 2020) and the planting of 1000 indigenous trees in the Irish Midlands (Root, 2021).

Luke holds a BA in Drama and Theatre Studies from Trinity College, and is Associate Director of PAN PAN Theatre Company. He is currently a Six in the Attic Artist with Irish Theatre Institute.

Luke was selected for Solas Nua's 2023 Norman Houston Multi-disciplinary Commissioning Award; comprised of a six-week residency at STABLE Arts in Washington D.C., travel and accommodation provided (in 2023), followed by a presentation of the new work produced for the commission (in 2024).


